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# Viva Maria Elena!

JUST A few weeks ago, Maria Elena Arana, Campaign Coordinator at Cafod for 30 years, was lobbying the UN Climate talks in Glasgow alongside Claudelice Silva dos Santos, a land defender from Pará, in the Brazilian Amazon, who has braved death threats to challenge illegal logging. She had already announced her plans to retire. On 2 December, current and past staff, Justice and Peace workers and international Cafod partners gathered at a hybrid in-person and virtual leaving party at Cafod's London offices to give her an affectionate and tearful send off. Cafod's director, Christine Allen, saluted Maria Elena's "amazing energy and drive over those 30 years".

Born in Chihuahua, Mexico and brought up in New York, Maria Elena met her English husband Robert on a demonstration in front of the White House and moved to London. In 1991, she was interviewed by Julian Filochowski, then Cafod's director, for the post of Campaign Coordinator. Before raising his glass at last week's party, he said: "Maria Elena exudes hope, energy, and positivity. Pope Francis would recognise her as the missionary disciple he wants us all to be. Viva Maria Elena!"



ONE OF the Church of England's great networkers, noticers and encouragers, Graham Kings served as missionary, scholar, priest and bishop in Kenya, Cambridge, Islington and Sherborne before winding up as Mission Theologian in the Anglican Communion. His latest book Nourishing Mission (Brill) is described by David Ford in his Foreword as "feeling like an embodiment of Graham Kings in print, characterised by energy and encouragement, with connections in many directions".

A youthful Kings spent a year as caretaker and cleaner at All Souls, Langham Place, living at the back of the church, where John Stott -

famously dubbed "the Evangelical Pope" - was Rector Emeritus in 1975. It was, Kings told us, a period when Stott's evangelical imagination was becoming enlarged through critical engagement with the Roman Catholic Church. In a letter to Mgr Basil Meeking, after Pope John Paul II's visit to Ireland in 1979, Stott wrote: "Many of us are deeply thankful for the Christcentredness of his messages. There are times when he sounds like a true blue evangelical!" Still, when John Paul II visited Britain in 1982, the unmoved evangelical said his attitude might best be summed up as saying: "We should welcome him as John Paul but not as Peter."

THE ILLUSTRATION on last week's cover - a slightly alarming cross-section of a brain divided between clockwork gears on one side and vernal mysticism on the other - generated several comments. Where is it from? If you squinted, you could have read at the foot of page 3 that it comes from a terrific documentary inspired by Iain McGilchrist's work called The Divided Brain.
