The Director will be a practising Catholic and someone who is in sympathy with the mission of the Church and of the Jesuits.

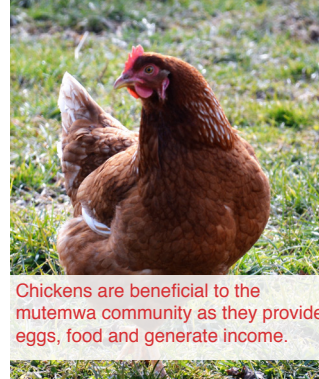
